



KNOW WHAT TO DO

IF YOU ARE SEXUALLY HARASSED OR ASSAULTED BY A STUDENT, TEACHER, OR SCHOOL EMPLOYEE

You have a right to attend school in an environment free from sexual harassment or assault. The school must protect you from a hostile environment, whether the harassment occurred on or off campus, or online.
